Moving and restoring the iconic Ann Morrison clock is next on the list of improvements. This project is to be 100% privately funded—we will not receive funding from the City of Boise. We can use your help with funding for mid-century clock faces, relocation, landscaping, and a potential solar element.

Come Play! Committee member Russ Strong and I visited the Audubon ReWild acreage plots at Barber Park to view their reintroduction of desirable plant species along the Boise River. These techniques may have a future application in the Park.

Fundraising continues with grant writing, parties, and presentations at service groups. Debbie Bloom will oversee the writing of one grant request per month through the year's end. Vickie Daly, Annie Anderson, Bonnie Wilkerson, and I are scheduled to present at the Downtown Boise Rotary and a PEO group in early August. # **Project Updates**

### Clock Tower:

Now that the first phase of the fountain is complete and the Peasley Stair is funded,

the Come Play! Campaign and the Harry Morrison Foundation are turning our attention to moving and repairing the clock. We are currently making a final fundraising push so we can begin the project in early 2024.



# Peasley Stair:

The Peasley Stair connecting Crescent Rim to the Park is slated to begin construction this fall, right on schedule.

Trivia Answer: The clock tower stands 43 feet high. At the time of its installation, it could be seen from any point in the park. It was donated by the Don Daly Family in honor of Don's favorite aunt, Ann Morrison.
